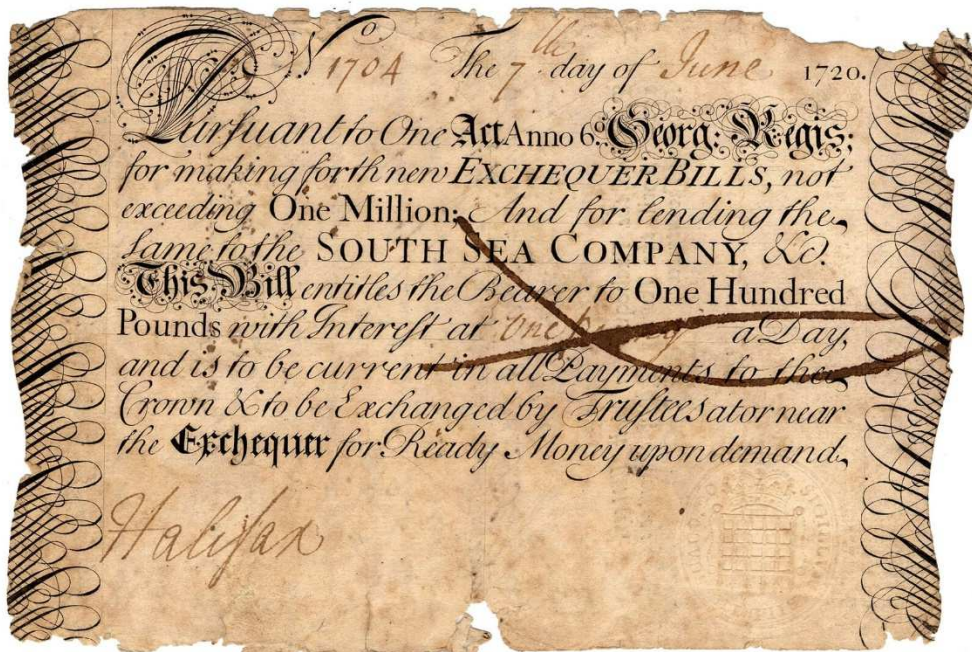





FINANCIAL HISTORY WORKSHOP
